A concise or abridged statement

What is a Precise

- It is a short summary of the essential ideas of a longer composition; the basic thought of a passage is reproduced in miniature, retaining the mood and tone of the original. It must posses clear, emphatic diction and effective sentence construction. Its unity and coherence should be emphatic through smooth, unobstructive transition.
- As per the *Oxford dictionary,* Precise means –a concise statement.

Essentials of Precise

- Completeness: Precise must have complete idea of the passage. The sentences must be well connected and the whole precise should reflect a necessary compactness.
- Brevity: is the soul of precise
- It is written in *Indirect narration* in past tense in third person.
- It should not contain our views/ opinions
- It must be grammatically correct.
- The heading of the precise should reflect theme or idea of the passage.

FORMAT

- Write an outline of the main ideas
- Put your outline into sentences/ paragraph form
- Count the number of the words and make necessary changes.
- It is an exact replica in miniature of the passage, often reduced to one-quarter to one-fifth of its size.
- Do not copy a single sentence from the article, use key words.
- Do not use the words "in this article", use the style
- Use past tense while mentioning about history
- Avoid using abbreviations/contractions.
- Avoid using "ands"
- Avoid words, like-big, good, little, and a lot. Also, do not use the phrase "throughout history". This is cliché. (over used activity or notion) a phrase or word that has lost its original effectiveness or power from overuse.
- Title of the text should be put in *italics* or *underlined*.

Passage

• If by some magic, you could be granted one quick wish, perhaps you might wish to be popular. One must persist in being likable to others.
